





• Asynchronous Classes: Here you'll still be expected to follow a traditional course schedule, but you'll have a window of time to complete assignments and watch lectures, rather than a definite set course time. Students do not virtually attend class together at the same time.

• Synchronous Classes: These courses require students to log on at particular times to participate in discussions or training, or to watch live lectures. These are the online classes that are most similar to traditional, on-site courses.

• The delivery method will be different based on the needs of the class. Expect reading materials to be posted or email, and prepare to having conversations in discussion boards, and/or take quizzes and tests on D₂L


I'm anxious about being an online student. How do I get started?

- * Treat your online course like a "real" course. When it comes to online classes, you need to have the discipline to sit down and say, "I am going to work on this," as well as the dedication to actually follow through.


DON'T PROCRASTINATE

D₂L

D₂L is a learning management system (LMS) for faculty and students. You can find your courses, class grades, and other resources from your instructor in D₂L.

While it is not ideal to do all of your coursework on a mobile device, if that is your only option, communication with your instructor to ensure you will be able to access the course materials.

How do I complete my courses if I do not have reliable internet access?

Many companies are advertising options for people who will be working or learning remotely as a response to containing COVID-19.

Please be thoughtful about accessing public spaces if you are exhibiting any symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, shortness of breath), are a member of an already vulnerable population, or suspect you have come into contact with anyone who may be at risk of exposure to the virus.

What is Zoom?

- * Zoom is a video conferencing tool, which means you can meet with your instructor, adviser, or other students from your home or other location. Zoom allows you to see and hear each other, as well as send typed messages. You can access Zoom from your computer browser or from a mobile device (phone, tablet).
- * Some instructors may have synchronous/live meetings (meaning everyone logs into Zoom at the same time), or may record a lecture for you to view later.
- If your instructor is using Zoom, they will send you a link for you to sign-on.




What happens if my internet goes out during a Zoom session?



- * Internet Service Provider interruptions happen. If you are working in your D₂L course, a Zoom session, or other tool when this happens, you can log back in when your Internet connection resumes. For Zoom sessions, please check with your instructor to see if they are being recorded for later viewing.
- If it goes out when taking a quiz or test, or are facing a deadline on an assignment, reconnect as quickly as possible. In some instances, you may not be able to resume the quiz or test. If for any reason, you cannot complete the quiz, test, or assignment on time, please email your instructor as soon as possible.
- If your connectivity seems slow and several other people in your home are streaming movies or games, your connection (and theirs) will likely be degraded. If you are using Zoom and the connection is poor, you may want to block the use of video and only use the audio portion which consumes less bandwidth.

What happens if my instructor's internet goes out during a Zoom session?

- * Internet Service Provider interruptions happen. If your instructor's connection is dropped during a live lecture or other session via Zoom, please be patient.
- If the session remains open, please give them a few minutes to reconnect. If the session ends abruptly, please try reconnecting.
- If the session does not resume, please check for emails or D2L announcements from your instructor.
